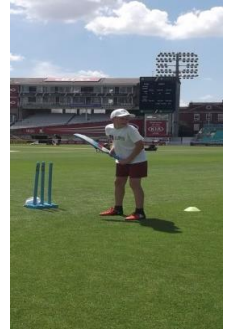
## Crusader's Club
