Understanding what has been read in books

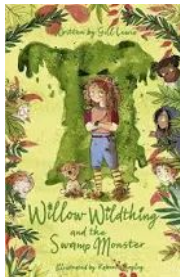
Listening to and discussing a range of fiction texts

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Place value

Recognise the place value of each digit in a three digit number (hundreds, tens, ones)

Identify, represent and estimate numbers using different representations

Compare and order numbers from 0 up to 1000; use <, > and = signs

Read and write numbers to at least 1000 in numerals and words

Count from zero in multiples of 4, 8, 50 and 100

Find 10 or 100 more or less than a given number

Addition and subtraction

Add and subtract numbers mentally (three digit numbers)

Add and subtract numbers up to three digits using formal written methods

Estimate the answer and use inverse to check
